I hope that you all had an enjoyable and restful Christmas and wish you a very happy New Year.




During this half term the Year 6 topic will be

“What’s Happening Now?”

and reading

“Floodland”

by Marcus Sedgwick



English - Non-Fiction, myths, short narrative, reports, instructions and information texts. Not forgetting weekly spelling practice and test, grammar, regular independent reading and regular reading to an adult. Being engaged in reading activities for about 45 minutes a day, would be superb (don't forget it all contributes to improvement in accelerated reading scores).

Maths – Decimals, percentages, missing number equations. Not forgetting further developing arithmetic skills and quick recall of all multiplication facts up to 12 x 12.

Science – The Heart – Body Pump

Geography – Natural Disasters – They will learn about different types of natural disasters nationally or internationally and find out about environmental problem. Pupils will look at the geographical causes of disasters and their impact.

P.E. - will be on Friday mornings this term – please remember that earrings need to be removed and long hair to be tied back.



After half term our class topic from will be:

“A Voyage of Discovery”

We will be reading

“The Call of The Wild”

By Jack London



English - Fictional diaries, balanced discussion, presenting two sides of an argument, following a debate and non-chronological reports. Plus, weekly spelling practice and test, grammar, regular independent reading and reading to an adult.

Maths – converting units, solving problems involving ratio and calculating perimeter and area. Also, continued development of: arithmetic skills and quick recall of all multiplication facts up to 12 x 12.

Science – Body Health they will learn about how to keep their bodies healthy and how their bodies might be damaged. The focus is on lifestyle choices that humans make, including diet, exercise and drug use, and how these are informed by scientific evidence.

Geography – physical geography Use the voyage of the HMS Beagle (Darwin's ship) and Darwin's recounts of the voyage to find out about: Latitude, Longitude, Equator, Northern and Southern Hemisphere, Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic, Time zones, Climate zones, Biomes and Vegetation belts.
